

Kairos Weekend Prayer suggestions

Begin by asking God to clear your mind from all outside distractions. Place your thoughts and your spirit with the people and the Weekend that you have come to ask God to bless. Be silent for a few minutes and begin to sense His presence with you. Ask God to bless with His Spirit the buildings, the grounds and all things used during the Weekend.

PRAY for the weekend leader, if not by name, by duty. The weekend leader must walk in God's spirit for anything he may be called upon to solve.

PRAY for the observing leader, that he may fulfill his responsibilities while also learning his future role as weekend leader.

PRAY for the advising leader, that he will provide the wise counsel needed by the weekend leader.

PRAY for the inside coordinator, that God's grace will flow from him as he acts as the sole liaison between the inside team and the institution's staff.

PRAY for the assistant coordinator, in much the same way.

PRAY for the family leaders, assistants and clergy as they interact with residents...that they will be instruments in building community at the family tables.

PRAY for the clergy, that when called upon to act in their official capacity they may be true instruments of God's spirit and grace.

PRAY for the head servant, family servants, and graduate servants...that they will demonstrate the humbleness of Christ as He washed the feet of His disciples.

PRAY for the speakers. Pray that they remember the One whom they represent, that they lay down self, and glorify God.

PRAY for the talks: Choices, You are not Alone, Friendship with God, The Church, Opening the Door, Discovery through Study, Christian Action, Obstacles to Accepting God's Grace, Walking in God's Grace, and Hang in There. For the message they give, and for those who hear. . that they hear according to their need.

PRAY for the musicians, that their music may bring God's message and soothe troubled souls.

PRAY for the residents. . .that their minds and hearts will open to the Spirit. Pray for the ones who can't leave their thoughts behind, the ones uneasy in the setting, the ones forced to come, the ones seeking to be a disruption, the ones looking for magic not miracles, the ones who are open and receiving, and for all conditions known only to God.

PRAY for the fun and fellowship, that it may warm hearts and stay focused on God.

PRAY for all prayer warriors.

PRAY for the support team, the cooks, and all who minister in unrecognized ways.

PRAY for all the agape gifts, for the hands that made them and for the blessings they bring.

PRAY for the residents in the yard as they receive the agape of cookies.

PRAY for the residents' families and friends at home.
